They must be handled carefully, as treatment can stretch, yellowing, and fray. Acidic oils from the skin might seep into the fabric when wearing a bridal gown. While these oils are not visible to the naked eye, they are extremely beneficial to mildew and bacterial growth. Take your wedding gown to a wedding dress dry cleaner for thorough washing to avoid such issues.

#3 - Professionals Know The Better Way To Maintain:



The best way to ensure that your dress stays in perfect condition throughout time is to have it professionally cleaned by wedding dress dry cleaners. With the carefully procured dry cleaning equipment, they know how to notice the stains and maintain the bridal gown effectively. Exuberant gold thread work, thrilling zari work, sequin patchwork, or ethereal ensembles of motifs are common features of bridal gowns. They're made of lace, silk, chiffon, organza, and satin, and only a professional wedding dress dry cleaner can handle them properly because each requires a different cleaning process.

#4 - Prevent Straining The Fibers:

The fibers will stretch with time if you hang your clothing in your closet. Therefore, it's best to box your dress to make the fabric flexible and tension-free. Your bridal gown should be cleaned and packaged delicately in a custom-made preservation box. The boxes are made of a breathable material packed with fine acid-free tissue and are sturdy enough to block out light and protect against mishaps. This technique is more convenient for long-term storage and provides additional safety.

#1 - Check The Label On Your Wedding Gown:

The majority of bridal gowns may be dry washed. Check the label for precise instructions on dry cleaning the bridal gown. Also, ensure your wedding gown is cleaned using the appropriate cleaning methods.

#2 - There Might Be Stains On Your Wedding Gown That Aren't Visible:



Some small stains, such as wine stains or other unseen stains, might develop on your wedding gown, and if the stain is kept on the dress for an extended period, it becomes difficult to remove. Professional [wedding gown dry cleaning](#) is trained to detect unseen stains and handle any stain on the bridal gown, visible or not.

#3 - Examine The Adornments and Ornaments:

Most modern decorations are of poor quality, and they dissolve when exposed to powerful chemicals; if they don't, the glue that holds them to the gown will melt, leaving the gown without decorations. Therefore, it's important to look at the gown's embellishments and see what's holding them in place. A bridal gown should never be stored with stains but should be dry cleaned as soon as possible before the stains become permanent.

Finally, unless you are a professional dry cleaner, you should never attempt to clean a wedding gown on your own. However, there are a few things that only a professional wedding dress dry cleaner can know, so always take it to one.
